Red Cross and Rebuilding Together Recognize Fire Prevention Week With Lives Saved Due to Smoke Alarms Carl and Loretta Kruger escaped devastating house fire due to working smoke alarms and fire safety education

National Fire Prevention Week is October 4-10, and the American Red Cross and their partner Rebuilding Together Duchess County urges everyone to test their smoke alarms and practice their escape plan as home fires continue during COVID-19. The two non-profits have joined together to install free smoke alarms and teach critical fire safety information in at risk communities as part of the Red Cross Home Fire Safety campaign. Every day 7 people die from a home fire, most impacting children and the elderly. To date the Home Fire Safety campaign has saved nearly eight hundred lives

Carl and Loretta Kruger learned about the Red Cross Home Fire campaign and signed up to receive free smoke alarms at the Golden Gathering hosted by Senator Sue Serino's Office, an annual event that benefits senior citizens. Little did they know that their action that day would save their lives. When a devastating fire ripped through their home of more than fifty years in June, the sound of the smoke alarms woke them. Carl and Loretta knew exactly what to do. The Red Cross and community partner <u>Rebuilding Together Dutchess County</u> had joined together to install free alarms in the Kruger home earlier in the year. Volunteers installed the alarms and met with the Kruger's to review essential fire safety information.

Although they lost everything in the fire, Carl and Loretta are so grateful to be alive and have each other. Carl and Loretta share their story in the hopes to encourage others to make sure they have working smoke alarms. They know first-hand they save lives.
